On November 22, 1963, President John F. Kennedy was assassinated in Dallas. On the same day in Los Angeles, the author of *Brave New World*, Aldous Huxley, on his death bed with cancer, slipped through the doors of perception with a large dose of LSD, never to return. Back in Oxford, England, Clive Staples Lewis, renowned Christian Apologist and author of *The Narnia Chronicles* died from kidney failure. Taking November 22nd as a triangulation point, Dominic McGill begins to chart American history and cultural change through the sixties to the present, in an attempt to answer "how did we get here?".

On view will be two new graphite works executed in preparation for a larger upcoming project. His epic 65 foot drawing *Project for a New American Century* can currently be seen in the *Greater New York 2005* exhibition at P.S.1 Contemporary Art Center.
